

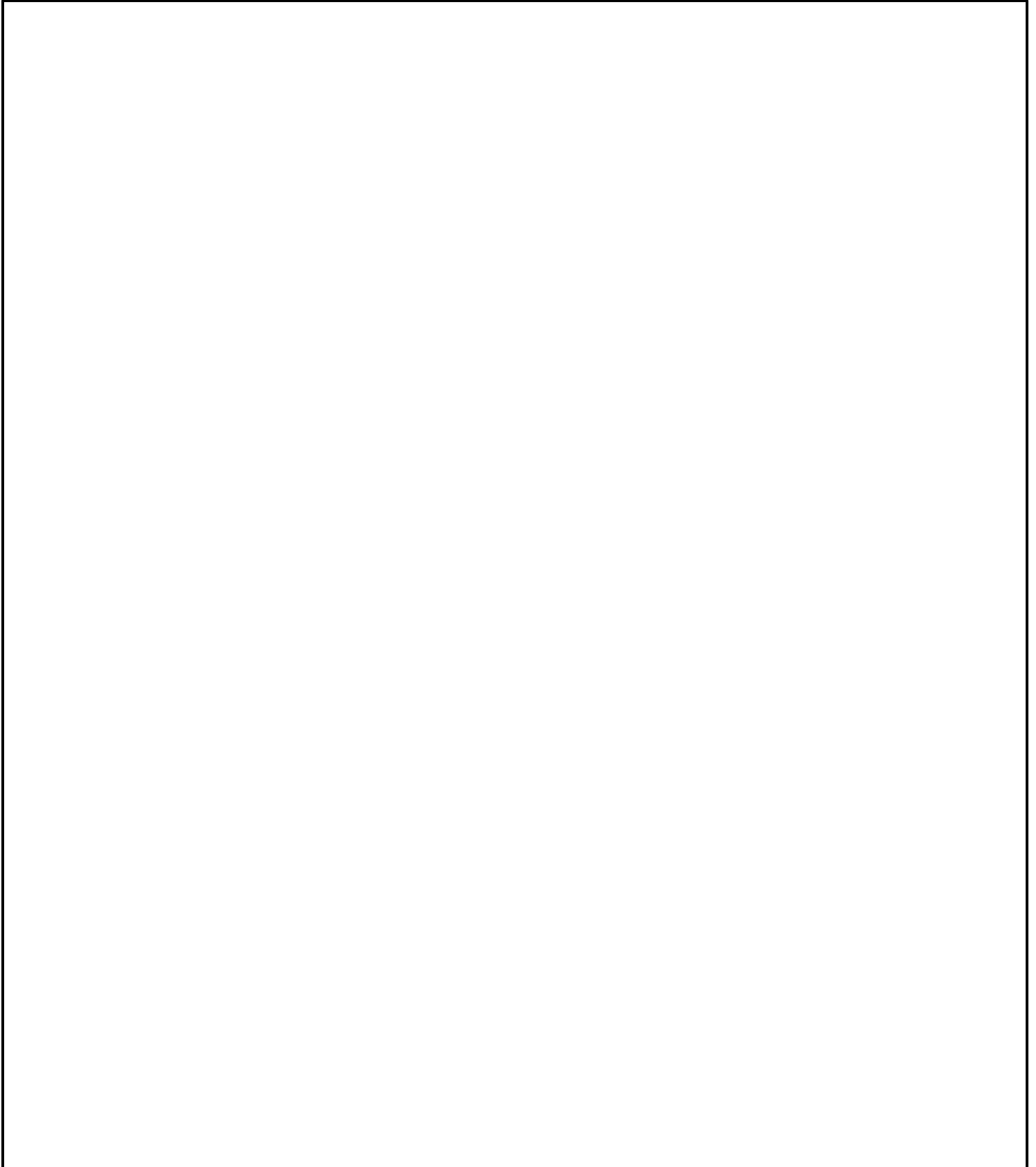
Part II (20 points)
