3. Bible Reading Assignment: Read 1 Corinthians Ch. 13. Create a 5 minute devotion/activity to share with the class during the first week of school.

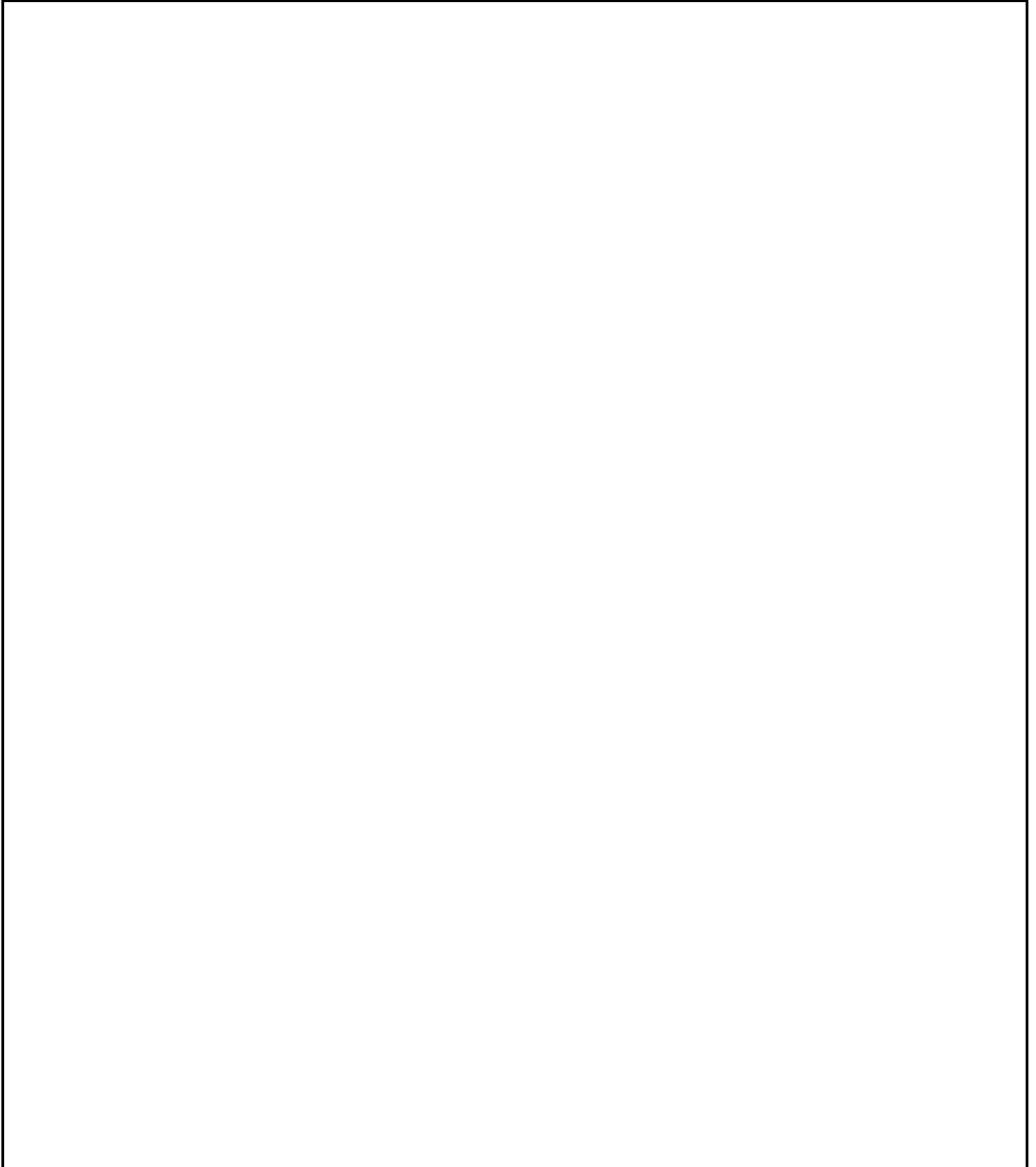
Part II (20 points)
